

Hieroglyphics	Hieroglyphics is a writing system that uses pictures and symbols instead of letters and words.

Secondary Source	A secondary source does not give original information. It interprets or summarizes information from primary sources.
Trade Route	A trade route is a series of paths or roads that is used to transport Goods.
Civilization	A Civilization is a group of people with their own languages and way of life.

 some (e.g. Chichen Itza) have become world tourist destinations in the modern day.
- They were also well-known for their advanced maths and calendars.
- Around 900CE, Maya cities became abandoned. No one knows for sure why this happened.
