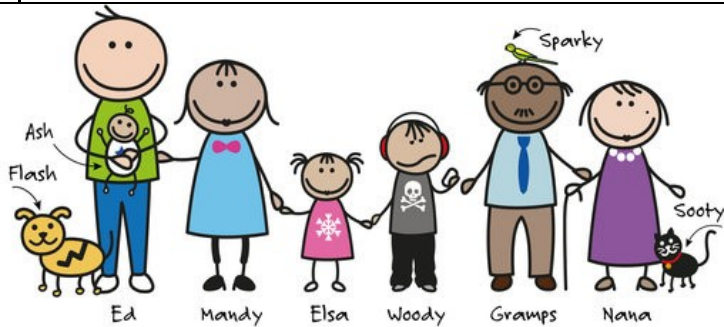
What do I already know? From Year 2

Key Words
