air drying clay	Clay that does not need to be fired but hardens in the air.	
sculpture	Three-dimensional art made by one of four basic processes: carving, modelling, casting, constructing.	
manipulate	Handle or control in a skilful manner.	
figurative	Representing forms that are recognisably derived from life.	
slip	Clay slip is clay mixed with water to thin the clay down into a liquid state. Slip is used to join pieces of clay together.
