As an Artist, what do I already know from previous learning?

I have experimented with ways in which surface detail can be added to drawings. I have made marks and lines with a wide range of drawing implements e.g. charcoal, pencil, crayon, chalk pastels, pens etc.

Key Vocabulary	
sculpture	An artistic form in which hard or plastic materials are worked into three-dimensional art objects.
wax resist	This is a technique where wax is layed down on paper and then painted over with watercolour paint. The wax resists the watercolor leaving the white of the paper exposed.
concave	Curving inwards.
"fine" drawing	The drawing action comes from the fingers or the wrist.
"rough" drawing	The drawing action comes from the elbow and shoulder.
