Key Vocabularly	
Street Art	Drawings or words made on a surface in a public place, often made with spray paint. If the owner of the property has not given permission it is considered vandalism, which is illegal.
Mural	A large painting on a wall or ceiling.
Abstract Art	Art which does not represent images of our everyday world. It has colour, lines and shape, but they are not intended to represent objects or living things.
Emojis	Symbols used to express an idea or an emotion. The word emoji is made up of the Japanese for picture (e) and character (moji).
Pictograms	A chart that uses pictures to represent data.














As an Artist, here's what I will have achieved at the end of the topic
