## As a Geographer, what do I already know?

- In Year 1, we used globes, maps and atlases to locate countries of the UK and
- their capital cities.

  In our first term in Year 2, we identified hot & cold areas of the world (using globes and atlases) in relation to the Equator & North & South Poles.



Key Words	
Continent	A continent is a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents. In order from largest to smallest, they are Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Australia
Ocean	A far larger body of open water than a sea. The 5 oceans are the Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Arctic and Southern.
Sea	A smaller part of an ocean and is typically partially contained by an area of land.
Channel	A wide strait or waterway between two landmasses that lie close to each other
The U.K.	The U.K. is a group of islands in Europe. It is made up of four nations: England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland. Its full name is the 'United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland'.

## Key information—What do I need to know?

- ♦ That the four compass points are NSEW and I can locate these on a compass.
- ♦ That the 7 continents are North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Asia, Australia and Antarctica. I also need to be able to locate them on a map/globe.
- ♦ That the 5 oceans are the Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Arctic and Southern. I need to be able to locate these on a map/globe.
- That the UK is bordered by four seas:
  - to the south by the English Channel, which separates it from continental Europe.
  - to the east by the North Sea.
  - -the west by the Irish Sea and the Atlantic Ocean.
- How to use a globe/atlases to assist me in locating these places.



## As a Geographer, here's the knowledge, skills and understanding I will have by the end of the unit:

- 1. I will reinforce my knowledge of the four compass points NSEW.
- 2. Through investigation, I will know what the 7 continents are and where they are located. I will be able to talk about their shape and size, and the continents they adjoin.
- 3. I will know what the 5 oceans of the world are and where they are located. I will be able to talk about which continents they surround.
- 4. I will begin to understand that Earth spins on its axis around the North and South Poles and that the Equator is an imaginary line that lies half way between them. I will know which continents lie on either side of the Equator and which ones straddle it. I will be able to talk about the impact that this has on the temperature.
- 5. I will know what the four surrounding seas of the UK are and where they are located.
- 6. I will be able to use globes and maps to help me locate continents, oceans and seas.
