Instrument: Percussion Unit: Singing, Ensemble Rhythms

Key Words	
Articula- tion	How certain notes are sung/played.
Ensemble	A French word used to describe playing, singing or performing together.
Rhythm	Long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.
Timbre	All instruments, including voices, have a certain sound quality e.g. the trumpet has a very different sound quality to the violin.
Notation	The link between sound and symbol.
Technique	The control of instrument to create the intended outcome.
Posture	The position to hold your body.
