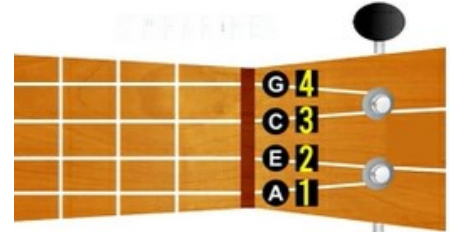

Key Words

Harmony	Different notes sung or played at the same time to produce chords.
Chords	More than one note played at the same time. MAJOR CHORD: A Happy Sound MINOR CHORD: A Sad Sound
Tempo	A musical dimension that describes how fast or slowly the music is played.
Rhythm	A musical dimension that describes the combination of long and short sounds to make patterns.
Pitch	A musical dimension that describes the range of high and low sounds.
Staff	In notation, five parallel horizontal lines that, with a clef, indicate the pitch of musical notes.

Genre

Electropop

A style of pop music. A synthesizer is the main instrument with electrically created sounds.

1. Introduction to the Ukulele

5. 'High C', notation and theory

6. Chords

I will learn to use the fret board to read and play two new chords— C major and an A minor.
