<b>Plot</b>	A secret plan to do something bad.
<b>Reign</b>	The period of time when a King or Queen Rules.
<b>Primary Source</b>	An account of someone who was there when something happened.
<b>Secondary Source</b>	An account of something from someone who was not there.
<b>Houses of Parliament</b>	The building in London where the Government make laws and run the country
