

Tailored pastoral interventions for children

An experienced ELSA team who can provide support for children and also advice around parenting and behaviour management in the home.

We aim to ensure that all children's needs are met through great classroom practice. This is called Quality First teaching. In addition. we use a graduated approach for children with additional needs, called 'Assess, Pan, Do Review'.
