

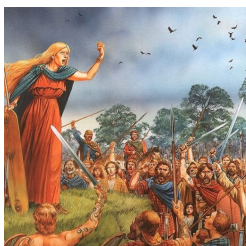

| Romans | The Romans are the people who originated from the city of Rome in modern day Italy. |
